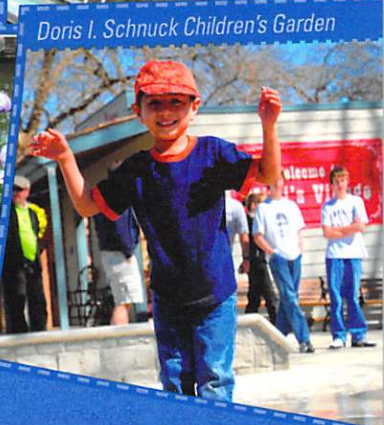

ACCESSIBILITY / HEALTH

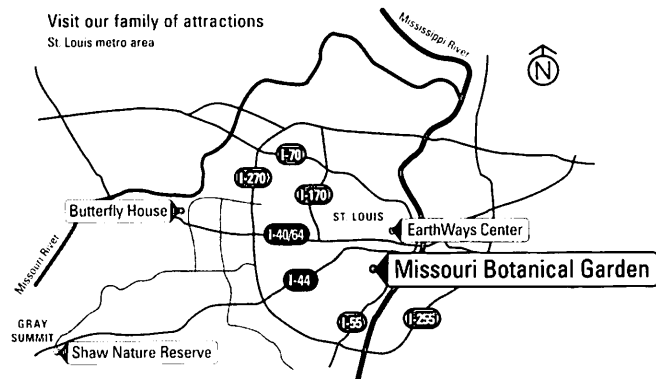

LOCATION

The Missouri Botanical Garden is easily accessible from the major highways in the area. From I-44, exit at Vandeventer south. Turn left onto Shaw. From I-64/40, exit at Kingshighway south. Turn left on Vandeventer. Turn right onto Shaw and proceed to 4344 Shaw.

PARKING

Limited free parking is available on Garden grounds. Additional free parking is available 2 blocks west of the Garden in lots at the corner of Shaw and Vandeventer.
