The 2,400-acre Shaw Nature Reserve in Gray Summit, Missouri, is home to tall-grass prairie, forests and glades, woodlands and wetlands—and one of the best native plant displays in the state. A regional leader in restoration ecology, native plant horticulture, and environmental education, the Shaw Nature Reserve has a mission “to inspire responsible stewardship of our environment through education, restoration, and protection of natural habitats and through public enjoyment of the natural world.”

HOURS

Grounds: 7 a.m. until 1/2 hour past sunset

Visitor Center: 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. weekdays; 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekends.

All visitors are required to stop and register at the Visitor Center.

ADMISSION

\$3 for adults; \$2 for seniors (65+).

Free for Missouri Botanical Garden members and children 12 and under.

Admission rates are subject to change. Special admission charges may apply for some events.

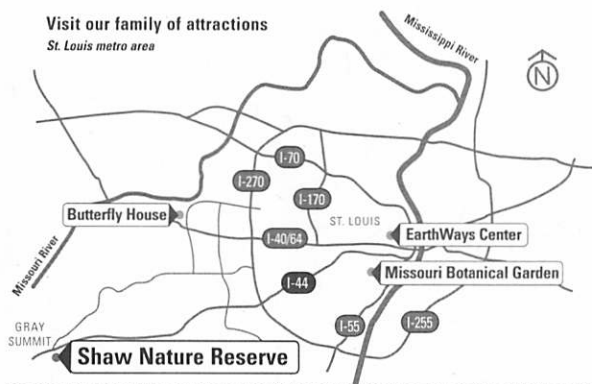
FACILITY RENTAL
